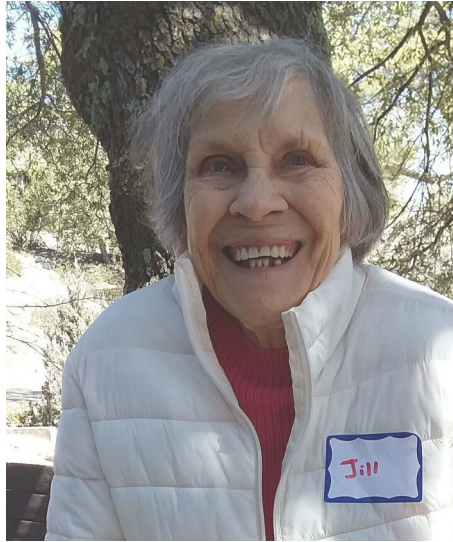

APS and the SRP. She moved to the San Francisco area where she married and became mother of one daughter. Judi later returned to the Valley where she attended Mesa Community College majoring in nursing which became her career.

Judi has a strong interest in her genealogical roots in the Karuk Tribe of native Americans, and a similar strong interest in poetry. She spent twenty-two years among the Karuk in their north-western tribal homeland studying and researching the tribe's history and culture and her own roots.

Originally the concept was to compile a book of her poetry (predominately about the Karuks) about the time of her sixtieth birthday. Things went slower than hoped and her book *Sixty 60* featuring her poetry about the Karuks as well as other topics of her life's journey was finally self published in 2017 and is currently available at Amazon.

Judi was invited to PUUF by Al Schober who she met on an internet discussion site. She says she has found us to be attractively and impressively different from the mainline churches of her childhood.
